"Therefore I Will Hope in Him" - Lam. 3:24

"Hope is a good thing, maybe the best of things, and no good thing ever dies." - Do you remember who said that? It is a line from one of best movies of the 1990's, about a man imprisoned unjustly for almost 20 years. He devised a brilliant scheme to defraud the corrupt warden of thousands of dollars and then to escape. He also managed to expose the warden's corruption and his murder of a fellow inmate. This all led to the warden's downfall. The movie is called the "Shawshank Redemption," starring Tim Robins and Morgan Freeman. There are several spiritual themes developed in this movie. One is the universal need of redemption. But the most enduring lesson is taken from the most famous line of the movie. It is said by Freeman's character, Red, as he is making his way to meet Andy, where he hopes to begin a new life. After years of languishing in prison he now has reason to hope.

Yes! This movie raises awareness of basic human needs. It may provide an avenue for the gospel for anyone willing to think about how we can possibly have the hope that makes life meaningful.

The human soul yearns for hope as the body thirsts for water. "I hope" We all hope for something. But what reason do you have that your hopes will be satisfied?

A more important question is, in whom, or in what do you hope?— Andy had pinned his hopes on his brilliance and his patience to work his scheme. Red was lucky enough to have Andy for a friend. Do you see a problem? What about those who are not brilliant or lucky?

At this point please stop reading these reflections, and open your Bible and find Lamentations 3:21-24. Read these words several times. Observe that the author has been surveying the devastating consequences of the Babylonian invasion of Jerusalem. The pain has been

severe and unrelenting. But in the midst of a desert of despair, he finds an oasis of hope. What is it? ... We will come back to this passage in a moment.

In the last scenes of the Shawshank Redemption Andy and Red are embracing on the beach in Mexico, far away from those who would try to trouble their lives. They seem to be free to live out their days pursuing their dreams. "I guess it comes down to a simple choice really. Get busy living, or get busy dying," says Red. Shawshank Redemption is a good movie because it is inspiring, and it helps us to think about what we really need. But had the movie gone on, and followed the lives of Andy and Red in years to come, we would have seen that they still lived in the same kind of world they thought they had left, a world where bad things can happen and luck runs out, a world that is often dark and confusing, where hope is often scarce. They would have faced trials that they were not prepared for, and eventually, they would have died.

Back to Lamentations. What did you find? Read (or sing) it with me: "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases" That exclamation is anchored in the story of scripture. That story explains the world we live in, and why we have the problems we do. It unfolds God's plans to redeem sinful people and set things right. In other words, the story of scripture gives an account for the problems we all have in this troubled world, reveals a God who is bigger than our problems, and who offers us a way out. The hope God provides is not based upon luck or our intelligence. It is based upon the promise of a God who is faithful.

In the movie Red spoke truth. Now Red, and Andy, and everyone else need to come to the only one who can satisfy the human longing for hope. The same living God about whom the Lamenter sang is there for you and me. Is your hope in this God? Can you share that hope with others?
