



How Are You Doing?

My new goal is to spend time in God's word every day. If by the end of the year I have covered Genesis to Revelation, great. If not, that is ok too. I believe failure is to miss time with the Lord and having the sacred words impact my daily life. Currently my reading plan is to read through the Bible one book at a time, however long it takes me. My goal is to spend time with my Creator and let His life-giving words feed my soul.

I encourage you to find a time every day when you can spend time with God and His word. Your time or method does not need to match mine or anyone else's, it

needs to be a plan that works for you. I also recommend, to all of us, that we make time to share what God is showing and teaching us with those around us. This helps us write what God is revealing to us on our hearts. Then we are more able to remember it when we are struggling or challenged, and we can use it to bless others.

Our theme verse for this year comes to mind as I think about these things:
