



William Tell and the Final Week

I have always loved Rossini's William Tell Overture. The fourth and final part of the overture is most widely known today as the source of the theme song for The Lone Ranger. (You can almost hear the hoof beats!)

But the second part of the overture is also easily recognized by many. It begins quietly enough with a few notes from the piccolos and flutes indicating drops of rain. But soon the music swells ominously as the strings and then the rolling timpani join in; the dark clouds are forming. Finally the brass and cymbals enter and the thunder storm arrives in a crash! Few pieces ratchet up the intensity of the coming storm the way Rossini brings it in *William Tell*.

In our worship today, we are going to witness the same kind of building intensity as we examine the final week of the life of Jesus. These few days are sometimes called Passion Week because of the intense emotion that took Jesus to the cross and the suffering (Latin *passio*) that he endured. The gospel writers spend 25-30% of their time in this week. During these chapters we see the conflicts between Jesus and the Jewish rulers moving from mild to his arrest, trial, torture, and eventual death.

When I rehearse this story in my mind, I am always amazed how everything changed so quickly. The first day of the week, Jesus rides in with a multitude shouting that he is the coming King. It ends with crowds calling for his execution on a cross, a cross with an inscription proclaiming that Jesus is the King of the Jews.

Whether Pilate knew it or not, the inscription was right. Jesus was the King that the Jewish people had prayed for, the Messiah. More than that, he was King of us all, King over Pilate, King over Caesar, King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

But on the final Friday of this final week, even his followers had a hard time recognizing who he was. His

flayed body was nailed to the cross. He struggled for every breath that he took as his life ebbed away. Only Pilate's sign and the mockery of a crown of thorns gave silent testimony to who he really was. But Jesus knew. He understood that this was not so much an execution as it was a sacrifice. He understood and he submitted to the torture, humiliation, and death.

The worship today will have a different structure from our usual order. We won't have any kind of a "lesson" except the narrative of the story of Jesus. Although the individual parts of the narrative are familiar to most Christians, the hope is that together we will come away with a greater feeling for what Jesus went through for us.

One final note of warning, we won't be ending on an upbeat note today. This part of the story of Jesus is tense, cruel, and sad. Next week, though, we will celebrate the victorious conclusion.
