



Mission Minded or Dethroning King Dumb

I've found that praying the same brief Biblical phrase for several weeks at a time several times each day works well for me. It's similar to steeping tea. The longer the phrase stays in my head to "brew" the stronger an impact it makes on me. The phrase that I've practiced this most with is, "Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven" (Matthew 6:10 NIV - when Jesus taught us how to pray).

I'm not the center of the universe and I need to remind myself of that... often. God's Kingdom and His mission are my kingdom and my mission. I can get that turned around easily where I'm living for my kingdom and doing my thing/mission. I want to be a part of bringing God's Kingdom to us, accomplishing His will on earth as it is being accomplished in heaven. I need this kingdom orienting phrase on continual repeat to remind me to live for my King because King Dumb – that's me sometimes – wants to do his own thing. King Dumb has his agenda. King Dumb builds his castle waving his prideful banner. King Dumb feeds his desires. King Dumb serves others when King Dumb benefits.

Living in our own little King Dumb, or Queen Dumb if that fits you better, is quite selfish and doesn't align with the mission God has for us. His mission for us is others centered and comes from the risen Son of God to whom every knee will bow and every tongue confess that He is Lord.

Recall Jesus' words at the end of the good news according to Matthew:

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Mt. 28:18-20 NIV).

God intends to use us to love and influence others so that they will become His followers. What do we intend to do? To pursue earthly gain and success? To live a comfortable life? To do everything in our power to be healthy and live long? No, no and no. We are kingdom focused rather than King Dumb focused. We are mission minded.

We love our neighbors, both those in Christ and not in Christ, the former so that they will be encouraged to be a more dedicated disciple and the latter praying that they will get a taste of what it means to be a follower of Jesus and want more.

We give financially extra today so that God's Kingdom work in Ecuador and beyond will have needed resources. We serve in various ways as the East Hill church family to motivate each other to acts of love and good works and to share the love of Christ with our community.

Father, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
