



Who Has The Influence?

This past Wednesday, the Republican candidates for President met in California for a national debate. Their backgrounds are in politics or in big business. They are smart, articulate, passionate, and attractive. They may even be wise. They are people of renown.

This past week, I spent time at a retreat with dozens of church workers. Some were preachers. Some were teachers. All were passionate about their work. And there was so much wisdom! But, outside of some relatively small circles, they are not people of renown.

If I were to ask the average person, "Which of these groups of people is making a greater impact on the world?" the answer would probably be the debaters. After all, they make laws, control high finance, and one may eventually be the President of the United States. These things are not insignificant.

But if I am trying to see through God's lens, I would have to say these church workers are more influential. Their circles of influence are smaller, but their impact goes far beyond the physical realm. Their influence is at the eternal level. It will be felt for generations, long after the pundits and historians are done talking about this election.

Think of the people Paul referenced in Romans 16. "Prisca and Aquila, my fellow workers in Christ Jesus, who risked their necks for my life ... Mary, who has worked hard for you ... Andronicus and Junia, my kinsmen and my fellow prisoners ... Urbanus, our fellow worker in Christ ... those workers in the Lord,

Tryphaena and Tryphosa ... the beloved Persis, who has worked hard in the Lord ... [the] mother [of Rufus], who has been a mother to me as well." We know nothing about most of these people except their names and that they labored for the sake of Jesus. They were not people of renown, but they were important to the kingdom of God.

Think about the people who have had the greatest influence in your life. Were any of them people of renown on the national scale? Were any billionaires? Were any celebrities or great entertainers? I doubt it. They were probably family members or teachers or friends. Or maybe members of your church family.

East Hill is going through the process of selecting additional elders. As we have asked for (and received!) names of men in this congregation that you would like to see serve as shepherds these are the kinds of people that we are seeing. They are workers for the Lord, influencers in the best sense of the word.

I would hope that every Christian seeks to be such a worker and person of influence. It is one of our callings. It is a blessing to the kingdom.

"Now we ask you, brothers and sisters, to acknowledge those who work hard among you, who care for you in the Lord and who admonish you. Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work." (1 Thessalonians 5:12-13)


BODY LIFE & PRAYERS
