Who among us has a hard time recalling a childhood memory of when we were hurt or sick, and only Mom (or someone in the role of Mom) would do? Many times when confronting life's hurdles, I can recall the mere sound of my mother's voice changing my perspective from overwhelmed to "I can do this." God has created

women with many abilities to, among other things, empathize, nurture, analyze complex situations and provide wisdom and comfort (think Naomi and Ruth).

Sadly, today many women find themselves feeling alone, misunderstood, disconnected

or simply not valued. Use of social media has now proven to be a great source of depression, anxiety and mental illness. In the Lord's Church, God has provided both a family (Mark 10:29) and a plan (Eph. 2:10) so that we can escape the corruption of this world.

God knew we needed restoration on a daily basis. Interestingly, the word "restaurant" or "ristorante" in Italian, comes from the word "restore". Restore, refresh, revive, and recreate are all associated with meal times. In Italy, meal time is sacred and families sit together at a table and eat home-cooked food. While we all have allowed the tyranny of what is urgent or convenient to chip away at sacred meal times, we can also choose to be intentional and allow ourselves to once again be restored through fellowship at a meal.

Many have read over the years the words of scripture that make it clear we are all equal before Christ, "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus" (Gal 3:28). Yet clearly, although we are equal at the foot of the cross, we do have differences that not

only must be acknowledged, but I say celebrated. God has divinely made men and women for differing roles, and their physical creation reflects those roles, for example in terms of a man's strength or a woman's ability to bear a child. Although it is not a scientific fact that women tend

to use 20,000 words per day while men use 7,000, it often feels that way. There is a dynamic that occurs when women can freely talk with other women. I call that magic. As much as our men love us, sometimes the sheer volume of our words or details in our stories or specifics that seem to have no bearing on what we're saying can result in a glaze-eyed look. While talking to another woman, however, not only does she precisely understand the details, but she will jump right in and add even more!

Heartfelt Friends is a ministry that combines the divine sustenance of a meal along with the love of growing relationships in the family of God. May each woman in the East Hill family be blessed by the magic of sisterly relationships in Christ, served alongside a good meal.

Prayer Requests and Updates:


