



Light a Candle

This past Wednesday marked the 60th anniversary of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. President Kennedy is remembered for his vision of what could be, seeing past the present problems. As he accepted his party's nomination for president in 1960, he said, "We are not here to curse the darkness, but to light a candle that can guide us through that darkness to a safe and sane future."

What is true for a nation is wisdom for the individual as well.

The story is told of a young man who was complaining to his father as he rode home from Sunday worship. His complaints concerned the songs that were sung week after week which he considered old fashioned, tired, and boring. When his father had had as much as he could take, he turned to his son and said that if he didn't like the songs, he should write his own. So he did.

The young man's name was Isaac Watts. Never heard of him? Maybe you know some of the songs he wrote, like "Marching to Zion," "I'm Not Ashamed To Own My Lord," "Joy to the World," "The Lord My Shepherd Is," or "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross." Those titles just scratch the surface of his works. Watts wrote hundreds of hymns during his lifetime, and all because he took on the challenge of doing something instead of lamenting what was lacking.



If you complain about the lack of evangelism among those around you, teach someone about Christ. YOU CAN DO IT. If you get bent out of shape because "nobody does anything for the church,"

You can be a leader. You can help make the church stronger. You may not think you are strong enough, but you can say confidently with Paul, "I can do all things through him who gives me strength."

We cannot all write hymns anymore than we can all be the president. But we can all make the choice between cursing the darkness and lighting a candle. Which will you choose?
