
Here is Job 2:11-13:

Now when Job's three friends heard of all this evil that had come upon him, they came each from his own place, Eliphaz the Temanite, Bildad the Shuhite, and Zophar the Naamathite. They made an appointment together to come to show him sympathy and comfort him. And when they saw him from a distance, they did not recognize him. And they raised their voices and wept, and they tore their robes and sprinkled dust on their heads toward heaven. And they sat with him on the ground seven days and seven nights, and no one spoke a word to him, for they saw that his suffering was very great.

I am remembering how these friends did not support Job, yet here it is clear that they wanted to be an encouragement and comfort to Job when they came. The fact that they wept with Job and sat with him for seven days and nights was the best thing for Job at the beginning of his troubles. It is when they started talking that Job did not get the support that he needed from these friends.

My prayer is for all of us to be the encouragement to one another that we each need. Sometimes the best encouragement might be just being there with us through our troubles!
