



My Favorite Verse on Worship and New Song Night

I wanted to share with you my favorite verse on worship (though, this might change when I encounter a "new" favorite verse!). The verse is Colossians 3:15-16 and it says,

'Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful.— Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts."

What a beautiful tapestry of worship! The first thread is that Paul reminds us that worship is about Christ. We gather to adore him, to meet with him, and to listen to him. It's not about us, what our voices sound like, or our preferences; just honoring Christ. The second thread is that worship is a group activity. Paul wants us to let the peace of Christ rule in our hearts, that is the love of

Christ to sway us into loving each other more and more. In worship, we lay down our differences and we forgive. We remember we are all part of the same body of Christ; that the

same blood of Jesus that saves me also saves you. Another thread is the message of Christ. The message is nothing less than the gospel of Christ; the story of salvation and the commands of Jesus that we are to teach and follow. Thus, worshipping is letting the peace of Christ rule among us AND letting the message of Christ dwell among us. Through it all, gratitude to God for all that he has done and is doing weaves us together.

This passage reminds me about the effect that going to church to worship should have on us. Worship helps us see Christ. Worship helps us to love each other as Christ does. And worship helps us to be faithful to Christ and the gospel.

One of the ways we encourage each other by going to church is by singing. I'm sure you have felt the power of music in your life; the blending of a melody and words that stirs your heart and causes you to long for God. But the power is not just in the music, it's in hearing and seeing *everyone* sing from their hearts. Thus, we're singing for God and we're singing for each other.

I like how Paul highlights different kinds of music when he says to sing "psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit." This tells me that we should sing many types of songs; not just traditional; not just contemporary; but all kinds of songs that revere Christ and the gospel. To

this end, we're bringing back something we called "New Song Night." Our first event is on Wednesday, February 28. All the adult classes will meet in the auditorium to learn and sing new and

old songs. We'll take it slow and practice. We hope that by practicing we'll be even more familiar with these songs and we'll be able to praise God with all our hearts, especially when we gather on Sundays. We hope you will come and sing with us! May we make beautiful music for God's pleasure and may the Peace of Christ rule in the East Hill family. Amen.

Canned/Jarred— chicken, tuna, beef and chicken broth, mustard, ketchup, peanut butter, jelly (variety), soy and teriyaki sauces, alfredo sauce, salad dressings (variety), cooking spices (variety), Nutella

Personal/Household— Q-tips, body lotion, disposable razors, Tylenol/ Acetaminophen, Advil/Ibuprofen, regular size feminine tampons
