



A Reason Bigger than You Know

Do you remember any of your childhood Bible Class teachers? If you were brought to church as a child, my guess is that you do. Mine was Thelma Lewis. She was tiny and she was mighty. She wore a tight little bun on the top of her head and a gentle smile on her face. She just happened to be the person who brought my mother to church when she was a child. Thelma and her family are the reason my mother became a Christian and is sitting in this church today with her children and her grandchildren and her great-grandchildren 75 years later.

One of the hymns I put on the walls of the church basement is:

"I Sing because I'm happy, I sing because I'm free; His eye is on the sparrow, and I know he watches me."

Thelma Lewis taught me that song. She brought a little bird's nest to class that I could touch, to emphasize her point (she was a hands-on teacher before it was a thing)! Guess who loves birds to this day? Guess who loves Jesus and children to this day? Because Thelma Lewis taught a tiny Bible class in Livingston, Montana, I knew that I was special, and I knew that what I did in life mattered to a loving God.

My mother met my father at that tiny church as a child. His father was the preacher there. Years later, I met my husband at the church where my father had been hired as a preacher in Norfolk, Nebraska. It became my legacy to belong to a family that belonged to the family of God.

As a child, I remember being so proud when my mama or my grandmother were my Bible class teachers (that's when you know for sure you are the teacher's pet)! I still teach with the flip charts and colorful materials that my grandmother made with her loving hands for a class of kids in whom she vested her time. I have two cousins that are members of this church who have brought up their families in Christ because of our grandparents' investment in us as children. It mattered.

We knew that it mattered because of their sacrifices for us and other children. It might even matter more in today's world.

My point is, when you teach Bible class, you may not know that you are creating a legacy for another family. You *might* just be placed in a child's life for a *reason* bigger than you know. Jesus thought it was important. Possibly more important than anything else. He was the one who said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." (Matthew 19:14).

Yes, it is a commitment. It's a sacrifice to prepare a class and place yourself in a vulnerable position staring down 5-8 little faces, eagerly waiting to see that you love them and care about what they do, what they feel, and what they think. That is huge. It's much more valuable than the commitment of taking them to a game, or dance class, or school events. You will be teaching them that their relationship with God is more important than anything else in their life. Your sacrifice could lead to a lifetime of connection to the Living God.

You will be blessed for teaching Bible class too. I promise. You will see a Bible story through the eyes of a child. That is a gift from God. You will see that children accept the Word with open and trusting hearts. What a sight to behold! It is grand to see trust and love in its purest form. It will be worth your sacrifice. As you teach (with the visuals and material that Hannah and I have prepared so that it is easier for you and more impactful for the children), you will learn alongside them. No matter how many years you have been a Christian, your faith will grow as you study to teach your class. You will become part of a child's legacy, belonging to God's family, by showing that you believe that children are the future church and that the time that you invest in them matters to God and to the precious souls you teach.
