



Love That Gets Noticed

There I was in my recliner, enjoying my morning coffee and leisurely following my daily Bible reading plan. Then Luke 6:35 rudely stopped me in my tracks. This verse is part of a section that parallels the last part of Matthew 5 in the Sermon on the Mount, but it adds an important emphasis that I had not previously noticed:

"But love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them, expecting nothing in return. Then your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High; for He is kind to the ungrateful and wicked."

— Luke 6:35

For my temperament, I can't imagine a more piercing verse.

Love Your Enemies — This one gets my vote for the hardest command in Scripture. I mean, isn't it difficult enough to forgive and love someone who has wronged you and has apologized? Catch is, such a person is no longer your enemy. An enemy is someone who actively seeks to impart ill toward you. That's the guy Jesus calls me to love. # ouch

Do Good to Them — The love Jesus demonstrated, the love Jesus commands, is active. "Do to others as you would have them do to you." (Matthew 7:12) Even pagans know to reciprocate good deeds done to them (Luke 6:33). Jesus commands that I take the initiative in serving my enemies. So how's that goin'?

Then consider lending without expecting repayment. How many of my good deeds— especially involving money— are prompted by a tacit expectation of reciprocity?

Love like this gets noticed. It sets a disciple of Jesus apart from the world and, regrettably, apart from most others who profess the name of Christ. Jesus says it makes us "sons of the Most High". It makes us like Him.

Our Lord goes on to single out an astounding attribute of the Most High, one mentioned only in Luke:

He is Kind to the Wicked and the Ungrateful — This verse exposed my godless heart. Nothing repulses me more than ingratitude, yet I can be shamefully ungrateful. Our heavenly Father is kind to the ungrateful, to those who live in ignorance of or in opposition to all He does and has done to bless them, to forgive them, to redeem them, and make them his own.

Though we're not to expect reciprocity, Luke 6:35 teaches that standout love brings the greatest of all rewards. We become sons of the Most High. All of creation "waits in eager expectation for the sons of God to be revealed." (Romans 8:19) The day is coming when all the world will celebrate the "outing" of God's children. Fact is, those around them will already know.

The commands of this verse are not things Jesus told us to count on "the church" to do. They're commands to every disciple that would follow in His steps (1 Peter 2:21). Our pattern for love and kindness to our neighbor is God's love and kindness to us.

And that's love that will get noticed.
