

Last Call for Ecuador Mission

One of the wonderful things about being a part of the body of Christ is that we don't have to be great at everything. We all are different people that together make up the body of Christ! As we read in I Corinthians 12:12-20

Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. If they were all one part, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, but one body.

Even though I cannot make an inspirational speech, I do have a place in the body of Christ. One of the areas

that I have been able to serve has been in many of the mission trips that have been sponsored by East Hill. When my children were in high school, I went with them on a number of mission efforts, both in the US and internationally. Since we have been connected with Operation Ecuador and the Marcums, I have been a part of the adult mission trips each time.

Josh would still like to have us come and help one of the churches with an addition to their building but he would like to have eight come to help. We are now reaching out to other congregations to find others but I wanted to make one last appeal for any who could come and help to please join us.

At this time, Glenn and Leanna Hawley and myself are committed to going. We will be leaving May 11 and returning on May 20. Canned/Jarred— chicken, tuna, beef and chicken broth, mustard, ketchup, peanut butter, jelly (variety), soy and teriyaki sauces, alfredo sauce, salad dressings (variety), cooking spices (variety), Nutella
