

Sugar free varieties of items are appreciated. Please check expiration dates. Pick up is the week of April 7.

Canned/Jarred— chicken, tuna, beef and chicken broth, mustard, ketchup, peanut butter, jelly (variety), soy and teriyaki sauces, alfredo sauce, salad dressings (variety), cooking spices (variety), Nutella

Personal/Household— Q-tips, body lotion, disposable razors, Tylenol/ Acetaminophen, Advil/Ibuprofen, regular size feminine tampons
