I have seen this same thing happen in the church. A truth-seeker is baptized and immediately begins to blossom. Surely there is nothing more beautiful to see than the zeal of a new Christian to grow and teach others. And yet the new Christian is also fragile, much more susceptible to trials and temptations and the vagaries of church politics than older Christians. Just as the frost does not harm the tree but kills the blossom, so it is that many stumbling blocks that the older Christians might easily bypass carry with them the very real possibility of extinguishing the new Christian's flame.

Will Allen Dromgoole once wrote a poem called "The Bridge Builder." In it he tells of an old man who came to a fast-flowing river he had to cross. Once he crossed the river, he built a bridge.

When asked why he built the bridge since he had already crossed, he responded in this way:

The builder lifted his old gray head;
"Good friend, in the path I have come," he said,
"There followed after me today,
A youth whose feet must pass this way.
This chasm that has been as naught to me
To that fair-haired youth may a pitfall be;
He, too, must cross in the twilight dim;
Good friend, I am building this bridge for him!"

We who are further down the Christian path should take this view. We must look out for our younger brothers and sisters in Christ. If the blossoms are in danger, you cover the tree. If our brother is in danger, we remove the stumbling block or guide him through the storm. Build whatever bridge it takes to make his path easier.


