



What is the Clothing Exchange?

If you didn't know yet, twice a year the East Hill fellowship hall, foyer and auditorium become a free shop for clothes, shoes, and linens for the people of the York area. On a Sunday evening, we move out the regular furniture, set up large homemade clothing racks, and move in a few of the 50 and more industrial size totes full of clothing from our storage building to be sorted, hung up, and replenished until it is all done. Over the next five days we clear out the storage building. Monday through Friday morning we sort clothes by type and size and hang them up in labeled sections. Friday, when the piles are gone, we clean up all the debris of going through more than 2 tons of clothing and invite the church family to come share in our efforts on Friday evening. On Saturday morning we give away clothing and shoes for men, women and children as well as bedding, and other linens. Somewhere in the neighborhood of 500-600 people come through that morning usually shopping for more than themselves. Saturday afternoon we clean it all up and move the regular furniture back in and if you weren't here between Sunday worship services you wouldn't know anything had happened. (There was that time a toddler got hold of a permanent marker, and the other year when the trash cans disappeared, but usually it just looks little less cluttered since we clear out the lost and found.)

When this event started, more than 15 years ago, it was quite a bit smaller. We really exchanged clothes; it was what we brought ourselves with a few community donations added in. Everything was displayed just in the fellowship hall, we only sorted Wednesday through Friday, and our big numbers through the door on Saturday were "almost 100!" While I felt it was a big deal and a little intimidating then, what we do now, would have been downright overwhelming. I point this out to recognize that if I was new to East Hill or just now thinking about getting involved in clothing exchange it would seem like an overwhelming beast. However, if

that is what you are feeling, I want to encourage you, "Do not be afraid!" We have regulars who can help you find a spot you are comfortable with and there are no bag sorting requirements for just walking through the door. You can leave anytime you want!

Tonight is that Sunday evening for this spring and we are always eager to induct new members. There is an ebb and flow to the availability of those regulars I mentioned, but also, that week of sorting and hanging is a wonderful family building time for our church. You never know who you will see and get to spend time with when you come for a morning, an afternoon, an evening or just a spare hour. There are really two parts to what the clothing exchange is. The most obvious physical blessing is the clothing giveaway to our community on Saturday morning. The second part is the blessing we experience all week as we share ourselves with each other.

Over the years there are two verses that keep coming back up as the clothing exchange grows and changes. They speak to our purpose and our method.

Therefore, as we have opportunity,

let us do good to all people,
especially to those who belong to the family of believers.
