Paul writes in 1 Timothy 6 about people who do not agree with the sound instruction of our Lord Jesus Christ and godly teaching (v. 3) and he goes on in verses 6 through 10 to say:

But godlingss with contentment is great gain.
For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it. But if we have food and clothing, we will be content with that. Those who want to get rich fall into temptation and a trap and into many foolish and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs.

My challenge to you is to be thankful and content with what you have. Take time to look for ways to serve others and avoid the temptation to fall into the traps of foolish and harmful desires, because the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. We are commanded to love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul, and mind, and to love our neighbors as ourselves. (Matthew 22: 37-39)
