



#### The Trials of Following Jesus

By many accounts this would appear to be a difficult time to be a Christian. Do you agree? If so, I would like to hear from you. A more personal question is, do you find it difficult to maintain a vital faith in Jesus these days? If you said, "yes," I would understand.

This question interests me because I have been studying the way college students embrace the Christian faith, or not, for over 30 years. What I have observed is that the times in which we live and prevailing cultural trends have an impact on the way people think and how they come to believe. Students raise questions now that I did not raise when I was their age and they consider as viable options life choices that would have been unthinkable 40 or 50 years ago.

When I look in the faces of incredulous students today the reaction they have, stated or not, is that the gospel does not seem to make as much sense to people today as it used to. When I encounter this kind of thinking, I point out that the gospel never made sense to the minds of people enslaved in sin. The wisdom of the gospel is certainly counter to current cultural trends, but it has always been countercultural. In fact, it is supposed to seem out of place in our world. That's the whole idea with this message about a crucified and risen Jew. If people in our world, or any world, had their act together, they would not need the gospel.

Think about that for a moment, and let's go back to the problem of why we might find it difficult to follow Jesus today. If you have not started trying to follow Him yet, I want to tell you the story of Jesus. I want to tell you who He is, why He came into the world, and what He did. I also want to talk about your story, what you really want and what prevents you from having that kind of life.

But if you have started to follow Jesus, and have

found it to be difficult, I want to say that I, too, often find it difficult. You tell me your struggles and I will share some of mine.

For me it is a matter of focus. I find it too easy to focus on my problems and my fears instead of on Jesus. It is easy for all of us, maybe especially Christians, to feel overwhelmed by the problems. Do you know of any corner of our world where there are no problems? Most concerning of all is that the culture in which we live is moving further away from the Christendom than many of us grew up with at an alarming rate.

What concerns me is that we collectively, as well as personally, are facing problems that no one is prepared for. I will admit that this is a great cause of concern for me. It occupies my mind when I am trying to sleep, dominates my conversations, and fuels my prayers. So, what can we do?

What I do is to take a longer look at the Jesus I want to tell others about. When I consider the life He lived I realize that in the midst of the teaching and miracles was a man with dust on His feet, very few personal possessions, no house to call His own, no wife, and very little visible evidence that anyone understood His message. The world of Jesus was chaotic, and His people were bound for destruction. He had answers for them, yet they were not interested. All Jesus could do was weep (Luke 19:41-42).

And yet, Jesus finished His mission, and He became "the source of eternal salvation for all who obey Him" (Hebrews 5:9). When I think about my problems in the presence of this Jesus I remember that trials are a part of following Jesus in a world distorted by sin. But His answers work especially well in a world full of chaos. ... If you agree, let me know.
