Deena and Tommy met with the Activities Director, at the Legacy, and found that she has been praying and asking for someone to come and conduct a worship service for two years. Details about the content of the worship service, including communion, time and frequency of meeting were discussed and agreed upon with the administration at the Legacy.

The elders at East Hill were very much in favor and gave their blessing and prayer support on beginning this ministry. We met for worship at the Legacy in November 2023, at 2:30 pm and have continued every Sunday since then. We observe communion every Sunday and most of the residents participate.

Those meeting and helping on a consistent basis include Harold and Deena Tandy and their family (Thomas, Robert, Michele and their families) Terry Kite, Hal Hockersmith, Sheila Tandy, and Anita and Tommy Carr. Others visit and help often. Thank you.

Residents enjoy the service, but they also enjoy the fellowship and conversation spent with others after worship, enjoying coffee, and a snack. Legacy Square staff greatly appreciate Tommy, Deena and all the East Hill members for bringing weekly services to the facility as religion is such an important part of the resident's lives. The residents have also often expressed their gratitude and enjoy meeting different church members and their children.”

We invite you to worship with us at the Legacy anytime!

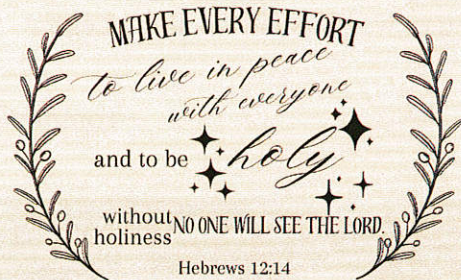
