

A Non-traditional Mother's Day Message

2 Chronicles 12:13-14 – "King Rehoboam established himself firmly in Jerusalem and continued as king. He was forty-one years old when he became king, and he reigned seventeen years in Jerusalem, the city the Lord had chosen out of all the tribes of Israel in which to put his Name. His mother's name was Naamah; she was an Ammonite. He did evil because he had not set his heart on seeking the Lord."

2 Chronicles 20:31-32 – "So Jehoshaphat reigned over Judah. He was thirty-five years old when he became king of Judah, and he reigned in Jerusalem twenty-five years. His mother's name was Azubah daughter of Shilhi. He walked in the ways of his father Asa and did not stray from them; he did what was right in the eyes of the Lord."

2 Chronicles 22:2-4 – "Ahaziah was twenty-two years old when he became king, and he reigned in Jerusalem one year. His mother's name was Athaliah, a granddaughter of Omri. He too walked in the ways of the house of Ahab, for his mother encouraged him in doing wrong. He did evil in the eyes of the Lord, as the house of Ahab had done..."

2 Chronicles 26:3-4 – "Uzziah was sixteen years old when he became king, and he reigned in Jerusalem fiftytwo years. His mother's name was Jecoliah; she was from Jerusalem. He did what was right in the eyes of the Lord, ..."

2 Chronicles 27:1-2 – "Jotham was twenty-five years old when he became king, and he reigned in Jerusalem sixteen years. His mother's name was Jerusha daughter of Zadok. He did what was right in the eyes of the Lord, …"

2 Chronicles 29:1-2 – "Hezekiah was twenty-five years old when he became king, and he reigned in Jerusalem twenty-nine years. His mother's name was Abijah daughter of Zechariah. He did what was right in the eyes of the Lord, just as his father David had done."

Do you detect a pattern? In the majority of the records of the Kings of Judah (all descendants of David), each time the next king is mentioned, his mother is named immediately prior to recording whether he did what was right or what was evil in the eyes of the Lord. You may be thinking, "So what?" Although there are many direct commands and instructions in the scriptures, there are also patterns left by the Holy Spirit for followers of God to notice as they ponder His word and how to live by it. The pattern here clearly tells us how critical the role of a mother is in the life of a child.

Each year on this day we honor mothers and motherhood. That's a good and proper thing to do. However, it doesn't follow that all motherhood is praiseworthy. Not all motherhood is equal. Like so many things, it's not the role that matters quite so much as how it's conducted.

Praise God for mothers in the pattern of Azubah, Jecoliah, Jerusha, and Abijah.
