



## **Ecuador Mission Trip**

We made it back, well most of us since Glenn and Leanna Hawley are staying longer.

It was a great trip and we helped the church in Latacunga in many ways and I will tell you about it.

We arrived in Latacunga after midnight on Saturday and checked into the hotel which was a nice and friendly place.

Sunday we worshipped at the church with Josh Marcum giving the lesson and the local evangelist giving a history of the local work during class with thanksgiving for our coming. We went sightseeing in the afternoon to a mountain lake and had lunch overlooking that lake. Many took a hike after lunch down to the lake and back while others shopped there.

Monday through Thursday we did lots of work at the church. We helped demolish concrete walls and ceilings around the old bathrooms that were inside the worship area to make way for a baptistry in that location. This included sledge hammers and a jack hammer with lots of digging and bagging up the rubble then carrying the bags to trucks and hauling them to a dumping location. This work continued all week. We also scraped, patched, sealed and painted the outside walls in the courtyard. We planted new flowers and plants around the courtyard. And we decorated two classrooms with scriptures, colored accents and painted trees on one wall for color.

In addition to the physical work we were invited to a member's house on Tuesday night. Along with many of the locals we had a devotional and singing with fellowship afterwards using translation apps and a few words that we understood.

Wednesday night we had a midweek service that Ben Butterfield from Kansas led. Ben and his son Samuel met us in Ecuador and worked with us the whole time. Thursday a member provided lunch for us at their house. Then we visited the farm of another member who raises guinea pigs and he had some BBQ guinea pigs for all of us to sample. (Yes, it tasted like chicken to me!) Then we visited a nursing home that serves the homeless and abandoned elderly.

We sang songs and handed out bags of toiletries for everyone as well as introducing ourselves to them. The providential president met us there and thanked us for serving these residents. Thursday night we gathered at another home for more singing and devotion led by Samuel Butterfield.

Friday morning we went to a local orphanage that also serves special needs young adults. A group of students from the Quito Bible school met us there and performed some puppet skits as well as provided some musical entertainment. We handed out the toys and stuffed animals that were donated and it was great to see their faces light up from these gifts!

After lunch, with the students from Quito, we left for Banos for some shopping and recreation on Saturday.

Sunday we returned to Latacunga to worship with Glenn Hawley preaching and Josh teaching class. We then traveled to Quito to have supper at Josh's home with his family before heading to the airport for the return flight.

I want to thank everyone for your prayers and donations to this work! It was such a blessing to work with Glenn and Leanna, Bryce Smith, Megan DeHart, Mayah Colle and the Butterfield's as well as Josh and many of the members who came out to work with us! I feel that I was blessed more than the members of the Latacunga church!

# **BODY LIFE & PRAYERS**

#### **Prayer Requests and Updates:**

Megan Fifield is physically struggling with symptoms, mainly a fast and irregular heartbeat leading to chest pain, difficulty breathing, and fainting, related to Wolff-Parkinson-White syndrome, and further complicated by other medical conditions. A heart ablation is expected to help ease or fix these symptoms, but still waiting for health insurance to recognize her as high risk for cardiac arrest and authorize the procedure.

Tim and Bev McNeese request prayers for his new radiation treatment that began this week. This is a new type of radiation that is injected into the body and only kills cancer cells, while leaving healthy cells alone. If all goes well, these treatments are every 6 weeks for 36 weeks. He is in limited isolation for 2 weeks after each treatment. They are very thankful for God's hand with his doctors and course of treatment.

Carol Shafer now has a place at the Heritage Crossings care facility (501 N 13th St, Geneva, NE 68316) in Geneva. Lonnie and Carol are grateful for the prayers and concerns expressed from the body. Continued prayers are cherished. Carol is in Room 116

Alice Yunevich has been diagnosed with atrial fibrillation (AFib) but was also told that this is not likely to be the cause of her chest pain, shortness of breath, and gastrointestinal issues. Pathology results of esophagus are expected on May 29. Next steps are a heart catheterization and a referral to a GI specialist.

The Youth Group will be returning from their mission trip tomorrow. Keep them in your prayers for a safe return home.
