



Doing Good in the Family of God

One of the great privileges of belonging to the family of God is the opportunity to meet each other's needs. This is for all kinds of needs; from spiritual, emotional, and social, to the physical. East Hill seeks to be faithful to God's command to love one another. One primary way we do this is through the benevolence ministry that our deacon, Marty Barrett, oversees. Marty has served in this ministry for 20 + years. I sat down with him a few weeks ago over coffee and asked his thoughts about this ministry. Here's what Marty had to say.

Why do you believe the benevolence ministry is a vital ministry of the church?

"There are always people in need who find themselves in situations that go beyond their control. Also, sometimes people have made unwise decisions, but now they are turning back, and need financial assistance to get back on their feet. This ministry is ultimately about following Jesus' command to 'Love one another.' It's about those of us who have enough to be willing to help those in need. That's the Jesus way."

Where does the money come from?

"It comes from our weekly offerings, and sometimes it comes from anonymous gifts. In all my years serving in this ministry, this church has always found a way to cover the need."

What factors do you consider when people request help?

"Each situation is unique. We give priority to East Hill members as the Apostle Paul taught (Gal. 6:10). In addition to understanding what the need is, I ask the individual if they are working and what their overall financial picture has been like for the last three months. I need to understand how deep the hole is. I also ask how much they can contribute to their need."

About how many individuals/families do we help each year and what type of requests for help are made?

"Last year we helped 13 individuals or families. Typical requests include bills for utilities, medical, auto, food, gas, and travel funds (to a funeral).

What else do you appreciate about this ministry?

"Rose and I have been members at East Hill since 1984. Shortly after we moved here, we lost my employment, and East Hill members helped us with job opportunities. We were treated with dignity and respect, and I believe that this is very important in this ministry. I appreciate the generosity of this church. In some years, it's been a challenge to make the money stretch for a whole year. However, the church has been great about finding additional funds when needed. I'm just so encouraged to worship with a church that gives generously and makes this ministry possible."

East Hill has been very blessed by Marty's faithful service overseeing the benevolence ministry. What's more, many of us have been blessed by Rose and Marty's direct care. They regularly visit our shut-ins and follow up with people's prayer requests. Please join us in thanking God for Marty and Rose, and let's keep loving one another as Jesus has loved us.
