



# **East Hill Youth Group Mission Trip 2024**

Whenever I have been on a mission trip I have had certain expectations of what I think the trip will be like. But what I have noticed is my ideas and expectations are very shallow. God does something special in every mission trip. It's hard to explain but I have seen it over and over. My faith has grown so much from the mission trips I've been involved with.

For the youth trip just completed, I noticed that we had a good mix of middle schoolers and high schoolers but I was also aware that most of these kids didn't regularly hang out together in York. I was concerned that our group wouldn't talk much to one another and that they wouldn't enjoy the trip. As usual that was a lack of faith on my part. About an hour into the trip the talking started and never really stopped. Including into the night where I had to repeatedly tell HS boys to go to sleep. The kids were able to get to know each other on a deeper level that wouldn't have happened without the mission trip. I got to hear Laela and Makai talk while painting a fence. They both realized they have similar interest in art. I got to see Joe Billington take Gideon Matkins under his wing. I witnessed Raima and Brianna get to know each other and pal around. I witnessed the MS boys interact, laugh, joke, and do MS boy type things. I watched Peter look after his cousin. These are just a few great interactions that took place on the trip.

One of the first things I told the group was that we weren't going to Shultz-Lewis to serve them, we were going to be one with them. To join in community with them and that's what we did. Our kids were amazing. They worked hard with the Shultz-Lewis employees and they openly joined in conversation and games with the teenage girls who were residing at the agency.

What has really stuck out to me since returning from the trip is Genesis 1:26-27 (NLT),

Then God said, 'Let us make human beings in our image,

to be like us. They will reign over the fish in the sea, the birds in the sky, the livestock, all the wild animals on the earth, and the small animals that scurry along the ground." So God created human beings in his own image. In the image of God he created them; male and female he created them.

We are children of God created in his image. We were created to be in communion with God, to walk with Him in the garden. There are moments in my faith- walk where the distractions of the world have disappeared and I am in complete worship with my Father in Heaven. Where the Spirit's voice is heard and moving inside me. Where peace and joy fill my whole being. Where I get a small taste of the garden before the fall.

When I was a teenager and young adult, I tried to figure out how much sin I could get away with. How could I walk with God but also satisfy my desires? How can I blur the lines, the truth, and justify it? The answer is, you can't. Those questions are from a person who wants the reward of Heaven but also wants what the world has to offer.

The questions we should be asking ourselves are, how close can I walk with God? How can I be in His presence? How can I be in communion with Him? How can I feel the joy of the Lord? How can I glorify my Father?

The answer is to walk in the light. To make Christ your Lord, living for Him and not yourself. To know His Word. To be in community with fellow Christ followers. To Surrender. To Serve. To Forgive. To show Grace and Mercy. To Love.
