



# Let's Do Small Groups!

The new school year is almost here, so it is time for our Small Group renewal. Throughout the school year (and sometimes beyond), we have several groups that meet on a regular basis, mostly on Sunday night. Our small group ministry is one of the most important things we offer at East Hill. Let me highlight some of the things that small groups can accomplish.

### Community

I love our Sunday morning worship time, but it is hard to bond to others in a big auditorium. Whether your group meets in a home, at the church building, or online, the more intimate setting provides the opportunity to really get to know people, to hear what is on their hearts, and to become a support network for difficult times.

I never get to know my fellow Christians as well as when I share family stories while drinking a cup of coffee together. In small groups, the tears, the laughter, and the prayers are experiences that make us feel like the brothers and sisters that we are.

### Discipleship

Small groups provide an opportunity for members to grow spiritually and deepen their faith. I preach every Sunday morning, but I am convinced that the greater learning takes place in Bible classes and small groups. Here you have the chance to ask questions, discuss ideas, and even disagree in a safe space.

Groups also provide the encouragement that all disciples need. As the Hebrews writer said, "Let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works ... encouraging one another." I know of no better place for this than a small group Bible study.

#### Outreach

Where do you begin with a friend that you want to reach with the gospel? You may not feel comfortable leading a study one-on-one, but they may not be comfortable going to a big church gathering on Sunday morning. Enter small groups, a place where everyone can feel safe.

And for the visitor, getting to know 8-10 people really well is probably more important than meeting 30 people for five seconds each.

Every time we renew our groups we are looking for host families and leaders. Have you bought a new home? Are your kids finally out of the house? Do you just want to take the opportunity to use your home for this wonderful work? Talk to me about being a host family. Your home doesn't have to be perfect. You don't have to provide all the food. No one is going to pass judgment. You just need to provide a place where your family in Christ can get together.

Is hosting not an option for you? Consider helping to lead a group. Leaders facilitate Bible discussion and usually communicate with families leading up to the meeting. If this sounds like something you can do, please let me know.

We will put out sign-up sheets for groups before the end of August, so let me know if you are interested in being a part of this ministry.
