



## I Don't Get It

At my recent family reunion in Colorado, the evenings were closed with a devotional time, a tradition that goes back 50+ years. Under the gifted guidance of the "younger generation" composed of YU graduates Joshua Marcum, Jordan Sikes, and John T. Langley, they had us focus on the Psalms of Ascent that were recited and sang during the Israelites' pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Psalms that recounted God's protection, waiting on the Lord, looking for His provision as in the past, the wisdom found in placing God at the center of the family, etc. A few weeks before the reunion, family members were emailed the theme and given the opportunity to participate in the worship by memorizing one of the Psalms to recite the evening it was featured.

The second night's devo was a highlight for me. Each family had the opportunity to describe how God's presence had been seen over the last few years in both trials and triumphs. One family spokesperson after another got up and shared, at times very emotionally, their experience and view of God's mercy and blessing. Some were celebratory in nature; others a painful work in progress, and still others holding out hope for God's timing.

It was an unscripted wonderful evening that for some was an outpouring of their heart and for others was an awakening to the Spirit's "daily grind" in family members' unique and challenging circumstances.

Then the unscripted got uncomfortable.

A young nephew who just finished high school walked slowly to the mic and introduced himself. Reflecting on the lineage of his broken home and that he was struggling with the evening's conversations, said, "I don't get it," with a shake of his head. "I'm hearing all these stories of how God is at work in your lives, and I don't get it. I don't see Him in my life. I want to, but I don't. I read my Bible. I follow the Ten Commandments. I pray that He will make Himself known, but..." He shrugs his shoulders and his voice trails off.

He asks us, his family, to be patient with him – that he's trying and will hopefully figure it out.

Family members gathered around him in prayer and conversations took place throughout the week with encouragement for him to keep asking hard questions and to not give up. To seek the Spirit's help in understanding the heart of God and lean on his family for support.

What courage! What desire! And in a surprising way... what faith!

I have to believe that the witnesses in Heaven referenced in Hebrews 12 were applauding his admission to doubt and the questions he raised to God's presence in his life. His yearning for what was good. His hunger for righteousness. His courageous call for grace.

Psalm 27:7-9 "Hear my voice when I call, O Lord; be merciful to me and answer me. My heart says of you, "Seek his face!" Your face, Lord, I will seek. Do not hide your face from me — do not turn your servant away in anger; you have been my helper. Do not reject me or forsake me, O God my Savior."
