



Following Jesus Today ...

This year brings unprecedented challenges into our lives as citizens of this nation. We watch as our political leaders, the parties they represent, and the process of governing, are hampered by increasing polarization and confounding moral compromises. As an American, and especially as a Christian, I find this spectacle frustrating and painful. I am in constant prayer about this and wonder what I can do. In what follows I want to prayerfully offer a few reflections.

First, I want to remember that Jesus chose to live the gospel of sacrificial love before lost people. He rejected Satan's attempt to give Him a kingdom of domination and power. His death and resurrection created a kingdom that lives today in the lives of people all over the world regardless of the kind of political system they live under. The New Testament, and the book of Acts in particular, illustrates that no politician or earthly leader can prevent the kingdom from growing in the lives of the receptive.

From this I conclude that disciples today will have the greatest impact by living and sharing the message of love and transformation with the lost and confused people of our community. Using gospel truths as political weapons will create enemies. Offering that same lifegiving message as a gift of love through acts of humble service will open minds and create friends. Through the first four centuries of its existence in the midst of a hostile political environment, this is how the church grew and made a dramatic impact on its world. It could happen again if Christians today are willing to pay the price and learn to fight the spiritual battle with the weapons given to us by the risen Jesus.

Second, consider the message of Daniel 7 about the nature of earthly kingdoms and the power they wield

over their subjects. Admittedly there are many interpretive challenges in this apocalyptic vision. But we need to dive into this chapter and learn its message because of its profound importance on Jesus and New Testament eschatology. The title Jesus uses for Himself most is from Daniel 7:13-14, the one "like a son of man," who "comes on the clouds of heaven." A more in depth study of this vision awaits.

For now, note that the point of the vision is to describe the coming of this Son of Man to receive an eternal kingdom which displaces the four kingdoms that have arisen from the sea (v. 3), and are ultimately destroyed (vv. 11-12). From this I would conclude that [all] earthly kingdoms are inherently hostile to the sovereignty of God. God uses earthly kings and the governing power of nations for His purposes, but ultimately judges and replaces them with His own kingdom.

If this is true, why should followers of the true king align themselves, and support the agendas of political factions that are fallen and sinful, and destined to be replaced? In these difficult and changing times we need to remember what Jesus said to Pilate, "My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews" (Jn. 18.36). The kingdom of Jesus is different from the kingdoms of the world. It is fought with different weapons, for a different outcome. Does this relate to how Christians should regard the political war unfolding in our nation right now? I think it does. But, what do you think? Pray about it, and let's talk.
