Harvest Season

"The kingdom of God is like a man who scatters seed on the ground. Night and day he sleeps and wakes, and the seed sprouts and grows, though he knows not how."

- Mark 4:26-27

In Nebraska it's harvest time! Time for the farmers to gather what they've worked hard since spring to grow. Many East Hill members are clocking overtime at work. There's a reason grocery stores call it "produce".

Glenn Hawley and I recently attended the Midwest Preachers' Retreat up in Wisconsin. The theme centered around establishing and leading churches that are engaged in God's mission into their own communities. After spending the past 10 days processing all I've heard and studied, I am left both uplifted and concerned.

One line that has stuck with me from the retreat is "God's church doesn't have a mission; His mission has a church". Let me explain using Acts 16.

If ever there were a Spirit-led missionary, it was the Apostle Paul. Acts 16 falls at the beginning of his 2nd missionary journey as Paul & Silas sweep across Asia Minor encouraging young churches founded just a year or two earlier by he and Barnabas. But then, Access Denied!! (:6) None other than the Holy Spirit himself blocks Paul & Silas from preaching the word in the province of Asia. Now why would the Holy Spirit ever prevent the Word from being spread?? The only reason that comes to mind is because God wanted them somewhere else.

They pass through Phrygia and Galatia before encountering another resounding "Access Denied!" when attempting to enter the province of Bithynia (:7). Blocked by the Spirit ... again. Through a nighttime vision, God directs Paul & Silas to the Greek province of Macedonia. (:9-10)

We're fond of saying, "God must have had something better in store for Paul & Silas". Right? Well, they arrive in Macedonia, convert Lydia (:11-15), then get beaten and thrown in jail in Philippi (:16-24). All part of God's "better plan" for Paul & Silas.

"Thanks a lot, Lord!! I've heard Bithynia's nice this time of year, can't we just go there?!?" would have been my response. Paul & Silas go on to establish churches in Philippi, Thessalonica, Berea, Athens, and Corinth before returning to Asia Minor.

Fruitful ministry, led by the Spirit. The Spirit was Paul & Silas' "advance team", working in hearts, lives, and circumstances laying the groundwork for their arrival.

Do you believe the Spirit still does this today? Do you believe the Spirit still works outside the four walls of the church building? Do you believe the Spirit still plows the terrain to prepare for us to scatter the seed in order to reap a harvest?

As I see it, the East Hill church is at a crossroads. The hard truth is for decades East Hill grew without having to actively evangelize the city of York. The congregation enjoyed a steady flow of new members and talent moving to York from other places, many of whom would "automatically" begin attending East Hill. That influx has abated considerably. In the '70s and '80s, the York University (then college) student body was composed of around 85%-90% members of the churches of Christ. That figure is now below 25%.

This is actually good news for East Hill because we can no longer count on growth by "swelling". We'll have to get out of our doors and spread the Word, New Testament style!

The question is not, "Does the East Hill church have a mission?" The question is "Will East Hill engage with God's mission already at work in our community?" The Spirit always does His work, though we rarely understand how. Our "job" is to open our Bibles, our eyes, and our mouths. Start by looking around the auditorium on Sunday morning. Look at the many new faces the Lord is sending right through our doors. Get to know them!! They're here to connect. Learn their kids' names. Welcome them, not just once, but regularly among our number.

Like in Acts 16, night and day the Spirit is still at work tilling the ground, preparing hearts, ordaining encounters for us to sow abundant seed in our community. All for a harvest.

Will you & I engage in God's mission from the streets or the bleachers?
