As I listen to this song, I think of other passages and scriptures in the Bible. All the questions that are asked within the song can be answered from the Bible and it gives me hope. Take a look at some of the lyrics to the song.

*Sometimes I wonder, is He faithful?
Does He see me in my trouble?
Does He understand?
Sometimes I question if He's able
Can He rescue, can He save me
Again and again?

In Matthew 25-34 Jesus tells us not to worry about tomorrow. He tells us,

Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them.

Yes, your Heavenly Father feeds them! Then he talks about the flowers and the field and asks,

If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith?

Jesus goes on to tell us that our Heavenly Father knows we need these things,

But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

Genesis chapter 1 tells the story of creation. Did he defeat the darkness? Yes, he did!

In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters.

And God said, “Let there be light,” and there was light. God saw that the light was good, and he separated the light from the darkness. God called the light “day,” and the darkness he called “night.” And there was evening, and there was morning—the first day. Genesis 1: 1-5

Did he move every mountain? Did he part every sea? Yes, he did! The story of creation continues to tell us in Genesis 1: 6-10,

And God said, “Let there be a vault between the waters to separate water from water.” So God made the vault and separated the water under the vault from the water above it.

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast. For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

The answer to all the questions is, "Yes." He is faithful. He does see you in all your trouble. He does understand. He is able. He can rescue you. He can save you. He can move mountains and part seas. He did defeat the darkness, and he can deliver you. Yes He Can!
