



### What a Blessing!

As Christians we are encouraged to count our blessings. "Count your many blessings, name them one by one..." I would like to take this opportunity to share with you a few updates about one of the areas we are blessed with here at East Hill: the blessing of owning a building. It is used in so may ways to serve the kingdom.

We have a place to gather for our Bible classes and times of worship. Our building is used for mission fundraisers, weddings, craft days, men's breakfasts, graduation parties, and many other events. Twice a year it is transformed into York's largest clothing outlet. Seminars, YU homecoming, potlucks, and fellowship gatherings are all housed here. Our building is a busy place and its use is a blessing to many. I would like to share with you updates on three areas concerning our building.

First, after many years of needing one, we now have an accessible sidewalk leading to the church basement. It begins at the southeast corner of the lower parking lot and provides a low sloped route to the outside basement doors. Our prayer is that this will be a blessing to those who have been prevented from attending activities in the church basement because it was not easily accessible.

Next, we are implementing a new way of communicating building maintenance needs. It is often a challenge to keep up with areas that need attention and items that need to be repaired. We will be posting a QR code around the building that will take you to a google form where you can note maintenance needs. Your request will be emailed to several individuals who will see that the repairs are made. Hopefully, this will help us all work together to be good stewards of what God has given us.

The final area I wanted to let you all know about relates to concerns for the East Hill Church of Christ Office located on the corner of 10th and Florida. Both of our ministers and our secretaries spend a lot of time in this building. The house used for our office space has an increasing number of shortcomings and has brought us to the point of needing to evaluate how to address some of the problems with this building. The elders have appointed a committee to look at the issues with our current office space and to come up with some options for addressing these needs. We are early in this process and no decisions have been made. Please visit with any of the elders if you have questions or input on this process.

The biggest blessing of the East Hill church of Christ is the joy of being part of an amazing body of believers, working together for the Kingdom. And we are grateful for a building where so many of those Kingdom activities can take place. What a Blessing!
