



Syncretism: Playing Mix & Match

Combining the beliefs, practices, and worship of different gods is called syncretism. Syncretism has been a perennial stumbling block among God's people. I would argue that it still is today.

In Scripture, even in times when Israel and Judah were spiraling into apostasy, rarely would they stop worshipping Yahweh altogether. The Israelites would masterfully weave the beliefs and practices of pagan religions into their worship of Yahweh. They were perfectly comfortable bringing sacrifices and incense to Yahweh while bending the knee to Baal and Asherah on the high places or offering their children to the flames of Molech (2 Kings 17:16-17; 2 Chronicles 28:3-4; 33:4-6). In all this, they kept Yahweh somewhere in the mix.

The Israelites were adept at directly ascribing both Yahweh's name and mighty works of deliverance to pagan gods fashioned to their own liking. When Aaron fashioned a gold calf at the base of Mt. Sinai, he tells the grumbling Israelites, "These, O Israel, are your gods, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt?" (Exodus 32:4) Israel's king Jeroboam does exactly the same thing in 1 Kings 12:28. They placed the one true God's name on their own god and beliefs. Sadly, in both cases, Israel followed along like a puppy.

God unequivocally condemned this mixing of His name and great works into their convenient, custom-made religion. Yahweh plus any other god is idolatry.

We often think of sin in sterile transactional terms. We break God's law, so there's a penalty to be paid. This misses the obvious fact that our God isn't a cosmic cop who "gives us a ticket" for sinning as part of his job. That's a shallow and wholly unbiblical view of us and God.

God's design from Eden onward is relational. "I will walk among you and be your God, and you will be My people." (Leviticus 26:12). Yahweh considers mixed allegiances a breach of relationship. We are not to live like those around us nor are we to bring secular priorities and practices into our lives and worship.

Over and over the Bible casts God's view of immorality, injustice, and especially idolatry—joining Yahweh with any other competing loyalty—to a husband, jealous for his wife, who will not accept her sleeping around. Israel's penchant for syncretism, mixing and matching holy worship and living with the beliefs and practices of the nations around them, drove the prophets to apply the husband/wife adultery metaphor to syncretism over and over again.

How we live, what we believe and the priorities we exhibit are to reflect our unrivaled commitment to our merciful but just God as set out in Scripture. It's not "transactional"—rules and punishments—in His eyes. He has "skin in the game". Remember that it was He who purchased the church with the blood of his own son (Acts 20:28), ransoming us from our futile ways of living (1 Peter 1:18) as Hosea bought back his unfaithful Gomer off the slave auction blocks (Hosea 3).

Let's not mix & match our beliefs and life choices with the trendy gods of our day, merely welcoming Yahweh into our personal pantheon of competing allegiances. He demands and deserves our complete loyalty and obedience.
