

Bringing Up Kids

Their service to our young people has been impactful and it will continue to resonate in the lives of our kids for years to come.

Consequently, we have been considering who we might appoint to take over the role and are happy to announce that Dan Goodwin has agreed to take up the position. Dan and Julie have proven themselves to be servant-hearted, willing to assume responsibility and have been consistently intentional about serving the children of East Hill. We look forward to working with them in this new role and ask for your support as we make the transition.

A word to the fathers of our young people: as much as we desire to help you in the task of bringing up your children, no amount of congregational support can substitute for your own intentional efforts. As the leader of your family, God places the primary responsibility of training your kids upon you. Paul, the chosen instrument of Jesus Christ, has this to say on the subject: *'Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.'* -- Ephesians 6:4

When my kids were little (about 4 and 6 years), I asked one of the shepherds of the church we were attending in Georgia how he'd raised such amazing kids. He said he'd just done what the Word of God said. When I pressed him, he quoted Deuteronomy 11:18-20: *'Fix these words of mine in your hearts and minds; tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Teach them to your children, talking about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on our gates, so that your days and the days of your children may be many in the land...'*

I'd like to encourage the fathers of East Hill to dedicate themselves to reading scripture, living by scripture, and teaching the things you learn as a result to your children. Do it daily. Do it continuously. Do it with intention. If you find yourself in a dry spell, rededicate yourself and get back to it. You won't regret it if you do.
