



Memorial

The Civil War ended 160 years ago last month. In the subsequent weeks, months, and years, Americans mourned the passing of that generation. More than 650,000 Americans died in the war, more than the combined deaths in WWI, WWII, Korea, and Vietnam.

A few years later, in 1868, the Memorial Day Order was officially given, recognizing a day to decorate and memorialize the graves of fallen soldiers. And so tomorrow, as on every Memorial Day, special recognition will be conferred on those who have given their lives for their country.

We who are Christians are conscious that we have been saved by a single life that was given for us. In Romans 5:6-8 we read that "while we were still weak ... Christ died for the ungodly." And that "God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." His life given for ours. A worthy life given for the unworthy. It is right that we should memorialize the saving death of Jesus.

The first memorial is the most obvious one: the Lord's Supper. Each week we come to the table and remember the body and blood in the elements we consume.

In mem'ry of the Savior's love
We keep the sacred feast,
Where ev'ry humble, contrite heart
Is made a welcome guest.

The old hymn is a reference to Paul's words in 1 Corinthians 11:26, 'For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes." The Lord's Supper is our weekly memorial to the sacrifice Jesus made for us.

There is also a second memorial to Christ's saving act that often gets overlooked. This memorial begins with baptism. When you are baptized, you reenact the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus. It is a visual reminder that the grace you are accepting began with a death given for you. So our old self dies, we are buried beneath the water, and we are raised again to a new life.

But that is only the beginning of this second memorial. Jesus said that every disciple of his would "take up his cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23). That wording not only suggests that there are burdens we must bear in this life. Much more, it is compelling us to remember Jesus every day and imitate him, right down to offering our lives if called upon to do so. Our very lives are to be living memorials to Jesus.

The modern Memorial Day proclamation calls on Americans "to observe Memorial Day by praying, according to their individual religious faith, for permanent peace." Permanent peace. Is it not interesting that the only one capable of truly bringing permanent peace already did it nearly 2000 years ago? Let us remember him today and every day.
