



The Consecrated Life

Take my life, and let it be Consecrated, Lord, to Thee

Our Wednesday night class just finished a lengthy study of holiness. We began by looking at the character of God and what it is that makes Him holy. But we spent most of the classes examining what it means for us to be holy in the same way that God is holy. That is as big an ask as you will ever come across, but it is what Scripture calls us to in both Leviticus 11:45 and in 1 Peter 1:15-16.

Holiness has several different faces, but most of it comes down to devotion, submitting yourself, your very being, to God for his purposes. This is what Frances Havergal wrote about in her enduring hymn "Take My Life, and Let It Be." Though she did not use the word "holy" in the lyrics, "consecrated" conveys virtually the same idea.

Take my hands, and let them move At the impulse of Thy love; Take my feet, and let them be Swift and beautiful for Thee.

When you make the decision to become a Christian, you commit to placing Christ on the throne of your life. In fact, the phrase, "Jesus is Lord" seems always to have been the heart of the Christian confession. This is more than just a ritual statement of intellectual belief. It is the singular controlling factor in the life of the believer.

When Christ is Lord in our lives, our words, our actions, and our movements are focused on Christ and his kingdom. Everything about us is set apart (*sanctified*, *holy*) for God. It spills over into every relationship, every conversation, and every motivation.

The selfish part of our being struggles against this. We would prefer to compartmentalize our lives. We can have the Sunday morning moments, sure. They are sweet, even uplifting. But when I get to work, I have to play by a different set of rules to get ahead. My recreational priorities have little or nothing to do with God. And

please don't bring holiness into my romantic relationships! Let Christ stay in church where he belongs. That is what I want to selfishly say.

But as Christians, our consecration to Jesus pervades every part of our lives. As Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 5:14, the love of Christ controls us. The more we are transformed into his image, the more we *desire* to be transformed into his image. This is holiness

Take my silver and my gold: Not a mite would I withhold; Take my intellect, and use Every power as Thou shalt choose.

There was a time when society considered it natural to consecrate yourself to God no matter what you did. If you were wealthy, you used your money for God's purposes. If you were a painter, you painted for God. If you were a musician, you sang for God. If you were a farmer, you labored in the knowledge that God provided the crops so that you could bless the people of his kingdom. Nothing in life was done without God involved in some way.

Society will never return to that place, nor will I lead a campaign to change our culture. But within the church, this is our goal. Peter says that we are "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God" (1 Peter 2:9). Such people proclaim Jesus in more than words. We proclaim him through our actions. We proclaim him through the people we present to the world. Consecrated people. Holy people.

Are you living the consecrated life? A life given wholly to the holy? If not, what kind of life are you living?


The Monthly Food Distribution will be Tuesday this week, July 22 from 10:30-11:30 in the south parking lot. Please spread the word.
