Phil Brookman, pulpit minister for the Memorial Road Church of Christ in Edmond, Okla., gave some outstanding talks as the keynote speaker for this year's Soul Quest theme of Follow Me. Every night, Phil would describe a different aspect or characteristic of Jesus and what it meant to follow him.

PACE LIKE JESUS

- 1. You must ruthlessly eliminate hurry from your life.
- 2. Those who create margin in their lives are the ones that help marginalized people.

LISTEN LIKE JESUS

We've all heard Acts 20:35 - "It is more blessed to give than to receive." Add the word "attention" as the object of this verse, and it helps shape this characteristic of Jesus. It is better to give attention than to receive attention. Stop craving attention and start paying attention.

3 Attention Giving Practices:

- 1. Encouragement
- 2. Curiosity
- 3. Sustained Interest

PRAY LIKE JESUS

Jesus prayed rhythmically not randomly. Jewish times of prayer as described in Daniel was 3 times a day. There were times when Jesus moved prayer because of the demands of the people around him, but he did not remove prayer.

How to Pray

- Lord's Prayer: Use words like give, forgive, lead, deliver
- Psalms
- Greatest Commands
- Spontaneous Praise and Requests
- Jesus prayed more with his body. Matt 26:39 (fell prostrate), Luke 24:50 (lifted hands)

DENY LIKE JESUS

Disney says: Find yourself, express yourself, protect yourself. The narrative of self-discovery is exhausting. Jesus says deny yourself. Matt 16:24 Gal 5:17 Flesh desires vs Spirit desires.

Self-Denial is a conscious choice to say "No" to the sinful nature within and "Yes" to the Spirit within. John 16:8 Holy Spirit convicts us of sin. Gal 5:25 "Keep in step with the Spirit."

Your deepest self was already hidden in Christ before you were even born.

Colossians 3:3 "For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God."

Jer. 1:5 "Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you."

LOVE LIKE JESUS

To open yourself to another is to open yourself to be hurt by another.

Luke 22:31-32 Peter's denial of Jesus: "When you have turned back, strengthen your brothers."

Jesus cares more about the spiritual development of his offender than the actual offense.

- 1. Jesus expects some friendship failures John 2:25 "Jesus knew what was in man."
- 2. Jesus doesn't rant.
- 3. Jesus prepares his heart for hurt before he's hurt. Use your wounds to strengthen the church.

Expect imperfection. Decide to let it go before it happens. Col. 3:13 "Bear with each other."
