



What We Need

Much of life is beyond our control. World events. Other people's emotions. Traffic and delays. The weather. Natural disasters. Other people's actions. The past or future. Other people's opinions. To name a few! However, we can control what we focus on. In this regard, the believer has a powerful practice at their fingertips. What believers need is to practice prayer.

Listen to Paul's words in Ephesians 6:18. "Pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people."

Pray in the Spirit – Praying in the Spirit involves becoming aware of God's presence in your life. It often means slowing your breathing and thoughts down to a single phrase, such as, "Hear my prayer." To pray in the Spirit is to open yourself to the influence and guidance of the Spirit of God.

On all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests — Pray in the morning and the evening. Pray when you start and when you finish. Pray when you're at peace and when you're anxious. Express your faith and your fears. Profess your belief and confess your sins. Give thanks and ask for help.

With this in mind, be alert — As you grow in faith, you put away naivete and become aware that the world is a dangerous place, with forces you can see and ones you cannot. You learn that there is no value in pretending that everything is fine, nor is there value in walking scared. Instead, remember that your success and security are in God alone, and in Him you trust, while you live in sober and trusting alertness.

And always keep on praying for all the Lord's people — Because you are united to Christ in your baptism, you realize that you're also bonded to his body here on earth; your spiritual brothers and sisters in Christ. You maintain the unity of the Spirit by loving and praying for them, no matter what. You remember that in this life, none of us needs to be alone; we have each other.

Of all the ways you practice living your faith, I propose that prayer is the most important practice. Imagine what could happen if you were more aware of the Spirit of God in your daily life, if you had more courage and love. What would it be like to not fear the darkness, but rather to shine into the darkness? How beautiful would our fellowship be if everyone remembered to pray for one another daily? I imagine if we could measure the collective stress of the people at East Hill today, it would be higher than usual. However, we can exercise some control over the stress and loneliness we feel by praying. May we be believers who pray in this way. Amen.
