



And He Will Establish Your Plans

I was recently asked the question: "How do I know that what I am contemplating doing with my life is in accordance with God's will? That's a particularly good question and one worth pondering. In my bedroom at home, I have a plaque on the wall that quotes Proverbs 16:3 – "Commit to the LORD whatever you do, and He will establish your plans."

In a world that thrives on self-promotion and personal ambition, Proverbs 16:3 offers a countercultural truth. Instead of committing to what I want to do, commit what I want to do to the LORD. This can be seen as a great blueprint for living a life that pleases God.

We must understand that when Scripture tells us to *commit our works to the Lord*, we can know this as more than a vague spiritual suggestion. It is a call to action rooted in obedience, humility, and trust.

Commitment Begins with Surrender. To "commit" in the biblical sense means to entrust, to roll over, to hand over control. It is the same kind of surrender Jesus modeled in the garden when He said, "Yet not my will, but yours be done."—Luke 22:42. When we commit our work—our plans, our service, our daily labor—to the Lord, we acknowledge His sovereignty and seek His will above our own.

Works Must Align with the Word. We emphasize that faith must be accompanied by action (James 2:17). But not just any action — works that are in harmony with God's revealed Word. Whether it is teaching, serving, or whatever work we are doing, our efforts must be rooted in Scripture, not tradition or personal preference.


God Establishes Our Thoughts. The promise of Proverbs 16:3 is profound: when our works are committed to God, He brings clarity and stability to our thoughts. In a time when many are overwhelmed by anxiety and indecision, this verse reminds us that peace of mind is a byproduct of spiritual alignment. God does not just guide our steps—He settles our hearts.

Practical Application. As we are making plans on what we are to be doing with our lives, let us ask: Are we committing these works to the Lord? Are we seeking His guidance through prayer and Scripture? Are we working not for recognition, but for His glory?

Let this verse be a reminder that success in the kingdom is not measured by numbers or applause, but by faithfulness. When we commit our works to the Lord, He establishes our thoughts—and that is the foundation of a life well-lived in Christ.
