



Numbering Our Days Wisely

Psalm 90 is the only Psalm ascribed to Moses, the man of God. Probably dating from the time of Deuteronomy, Moses prays a painful yet authentic lament on why Israel's decades in the wilderness had been so tumultuous. Over three millennia hence, this ancient prayer speaks much to the spirit of our times in 2025.

The psalm begins by affirming God's eternal, steadfast nature:

'Lord, You have been our dwelling place through all generations. Before the mountains were born or You brought forth the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting You are God." (vv. 1–2).

As technology advances at break-neck speed and world events erupt like popcorn, our daily lives can seem transient and isolated by comparison. Part of me wants just to stay out of it all, yet I need the reminder: God is not moved. "For in Your sight a thousand years [or news headlines] are but a day that passes" (v. 4) My stability can't be moored to these changing times, but to my unchanging Lord.

Moses had lived the fruit of unfaithfulness first hand, both in God's people and in himself, "For we are consumed by Your anger and terrified by Your wrath. You have set our iniquities before You, our secret sins in the light of Your presence ... we finish our years with a sigh." (vv. 7-9) Moses was about to "finish his years", with a sigh, on Mount Nebo (Deut. 34:1-6). How we finish our years begins with how we finish 2025.

Does your 2025 resemble today's "new normal", navigating into a fire-hose of appointments, projects, digital distractions, along with a nagging inner sense that you're not quite touching all the bases? Embrace Moses' call back to perspective. "You return man to dust ... The length of our days is seventy years—or eighty if we are strong" (vv. 3, 10). Even a long life is like a watch in the night to God. (v. 4) Almost seems unfair until we consider how God's wrath merely "matches the fear He is due" (v. 11)

Why not turn Psalm 90's crescendo into your prayer? "Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom." (v. 12). Wisdom in 2025 is no different than in Moses' time. It's never been about staying abreast of current trends or sporting the latest buzz words on your LinkedIn profile. Biblical wisdom is the ability and will to make godly decisions. Living in service to God, family, and our neighbor while keeping eternity in our sights.

Moses yearned to see God's work and splendor, and begged Him to establish all that he put his hands to (v. 17). Make Psalm 90 the guide for numbering your days, by anchoring our 2025 perspective to the truths to which Moses anchored his: God is eternal, life is brief, and wise living comes through seeking Him one day at a time.
