



# **Christ Is Being Preached!**

The recent passing of Charlie Kirk has left a profound impact on many across our nation and world, particularly among young adults and teens. Kirk's approach was bold and unapologetic, speaking in arenas where many hesitate. Whether you agreed with him or not, there's no denying that he was committed to his beliefs and that his relationship with Jesus was the cornerstone of his identity. He was more than a political activist; he was a passionate messenger who understood that the ultimate truth he sought to promote was grounded in his faith.

In the past two weeks, I've listened to more profess their faith in Jesus on TV news segments, political networks, and even at sporting events than I have ever heard before. At Kirk's memorial service, Vice President JD Vance shared that he had always felt a little uncomfortable talking about his faith in public, but that Charlie's courage had inspired him to openly discuss his own beliefs. He said, "As much as I love the Lord, and as much as it was an important part of my life, I have talked more about Jesus Christ in the past two weeks than I have my entire time in public life."

I asked my daughter for her youthful insight into this and this is a snippet of what she had to say. "Here's the thing I've concluded about Charlie. He was extremely bold about his faith, and I think at his core he was a very genuine person who cared deeply about others. He was a talented speaker/debater, and he wanted to see more people come into the kingdom.

"Unfortunately, it's also true that he was polarizing...
very polarizing. His tone at times really put people off.
Even if I agreed with what he was saying, I didn't always

agree with how he said it. That said — we are called to have bold faith. Much of what Charlie said is spot on, and I have felt challenged by all of this to be more courageous with my faith."

Paul addresses this kind of tension in the first chapter of Philippians where the gospel is being courageously professed by those who are doing it with all sincerity, good will, and out of love — verses those who are preaching Christ out of envy, rivalry, and selfish ambition, hoping to stir up trouble.

Whether you personally view that Charlie Kirk was in the first camp that Paul describes in this passage or the second isn't the true focus. Here is Paul's conclusion:

"But what does it matter? The important thing is that in every way, whether from false motives or true, Christ is preached. And because of this I rejoice." Phil. 1:18

Be in prayer for our nation — that we would turn our eyes upon Jesus.

Be in prayer for our church — that we would be a light in the darkness.

Be in prayer for your witness — that you would look for opportunities to share the good news.

Then with bold confidence we can echo Paul's words a few verses later in the same chapter:

"For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain." Phil. 1:21
