

World Advice?

The world is full of advice. The internet is full of “hacks” and ways to shortcut the systems we use. Everyone is full of ideas. We need to be careful about where we’re getting advice from and who we follow. Some examples are light and don’t really hurt anything if you try them. For example, I watched a video that showed how to put zip ties on the end of the weed eater so you don’t have to constantly change the string. It does not work, at all. The zip ties will break immediately. I watched another video that showed how to hold the end of the nail clippers closed then slide the lever forward so the sharp part is closed. It’s supposed to be safer. It doesn’t work, at all. Moving on to more serious things that I don’t think anyone should try. I read some advice for people looking for jobs. The advice was to not tell the interviewer that you are looking for a good work life balance. The advice is to, instead, tell the interviewer you are willing to work 80 hours a week. Yikes. This is where discernment and honesty comes in. If you’re not willing to work 80 hours a week, you probably should not say that.

Now on to advice we should follow. The scriptures are full of guidance for us to follow. Keep in mind that 1 Timothy 3:16-17 tells us that all scripture is God-breathed.

“All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.”

A few weeks ago, our memory verse was in Colossians 4:6. Paul gives us some solid advice that we need to follow in this section. Colossians 4:2-6 says:

Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. And pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains. Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should. Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity. Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone.

The breakdown: Pray, be aware and be thankful. Pray for others so that God’s message can be shared and shared in an effective way. Make the most of every opportunity and be a positive example. When you talk with others, be sure to show grace and “read the room” so you can talk with others in a way that will have a positive impact. It matters how we interact with others and we need to be self-aware so we can share God’s word and bring others closer to Him.
