



GOD'S ANSWER FOR ANXIETY IN THIS ANXIOUS WORLD

We look around this world today and see anxiety everywhere. From economic uncertainty to health scares, extreme political unrest to personal struggles, the weight of worry seems relentless. Anxiety is a topic where many of us want to bury our head in the sand. Sometimes I just want to eat another donut and forget about it. But no matter how hard I may toil against it, it doesn't seem to go away. I'm excited that the ladies are going to tackle this difficult subject in their upcoming ladies retreat this coming weekend. I believe they have a great slate of speakers and talks coming up that will be of great benefit for all who attend. I would encourage all the ladies of the congregation who are able to attend this important ladies' retreat. In the meantime, I would like to add my two cents here.

In our times of what feels like crippling anxiety we must remember that God has not left us without comfort or direction. His Word offers a powerful answer to our anxious heart.

Jesus Himself addressed anxiety directly. In Matthew 6:25–34, He urged His followers not to worry about their lives, reminding them of God's care for the birds of the air and the lilies of the field. "Seek first His kingdom and His righteousness," He said, "and all these things will be added to you" – v-33. This isn't a call to ignore life's challenges—it's a call to trust the One who holds everything together.

The apostle Paul echoed this in Philippians 4:6–7: "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." Prayer is not just a spiritual exercise — it's a lifeline to peace.

We can know that true rest and relief from anxiety come through obedience to the gospel and a life rooted in Christ. Psalm 127:2 reminds us that 'It is in vain that you rise up early and go late to rest, eating the bread of anxious toil;" – (ESV). Solomon knew that peace is found not in striving, but in trusting our Father, "For He gives to His beloved even in his sleep" – (NASB).

If you're feeling overwhelmed, know this: God sees you. He invites you to come to Him. "Come to me, all who are weary and are heavy-laden, and I will give you rest" – Matt 11:28. That promise is not just for the ancient world – it's for you today, right now.

Let's strive to be a congregation that not only teaches this truth but lives it. May we be a refuge for the anxious, a family of faith that lifts one another up in prayer, and a light in a world that desperately needs hope.
