

Entrusting Him Who Judges Justly

Our small group has been reading through 1 Peter this fall. Although it's not the first time I've read Peter's letters, one of the amazing things to me about God's word is that there's always something more to notice. Usually it's not something entirely new, but rather a new perspective on something I thought I was already pretty familiar with.

In 1 Peter 2:23, Peter talks about how Christ didn't retaliate when insulted or make threats when he was being abused. This much I, like everyone who knows the story of Jesus, was aware of. What I've been thinking more about lately is the last part of the verse in which it says, "Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly."

The question of why bad things happen to good people is asked fairly often. It's a good question. However, it's also one that is challenging to answer to anyone's satisfaction. I think a more practical question is, "What should we do if bad things happen to us even when we are doing our best to live a good life." This is a question for which we have been given an answer. We have the living example of Jesus showing us that putting your trust in God is best.

When Jesus was being insulted, he entrusted himself to God. When he was being falsely accused, he entrusted himself to God. When he was being abused, he entrusted himself to God. When he was told by

Pilate that he had the power to crucify him, Jesus put his trust in God. None of these things did Jesus deserve, but although he had the power to retaliate, he chose not to. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly.

I'm not claiming to have always followed this example or that I always will. But, I have no doubt that it is the right way to handle difficult things in life. After all, if it was good enough for Jesus, it's certainly good enough for me.
