



The Coming Adventure

When I was a child, my parents would occasionally support a Christian children's home by purchasing an Advent calendar. At the time, I thought that Advent was just a strange way of saying Christmas. It wasn't until I was older that I learned what this Christian tradition was really about.

I say tradition because the term "Advent" is nowhere mentioned in Scripture. It is a very old tradition, going back at least to the 5th Century. And yet the ideas behind it are easily seen in the biblical text.

"Advent" refers to the arrival of a notable person, thing, or event. It comes from the same Latin root that gives us the word "adventure" and carries with it a sense of anticipation. Contrary to what I thought as a child, however, the anticipation is not about the arrival of Christmas, but the arrival of Jesus. For those who celebrate it, a large part of Advent is putting yourself in the mindset of those who were anticipating the Messiah. Old Testament prophecy predicting a far off coming of the Christ is a big part of this. Stories of Joseph and Mary are also central since they are served notice that the Messiah will be coming to them specifically. It is appropriate to ask yourself what it would be like to have this heart-pounding anticipation of God gracing himself into our lives through this unique event.

But this is not the whole context of Advent. A more important aspect of it, for me at least, has to do with the Christian anticipation of the Second Coming of Christ. I see the birth of Jesus as the first glorious scene in a drama that stretches to and then far beyond the crucifixion and resurrection. The ascension of Jesus back to the Father came with a promise that one day he would return in the same manner (Acts 1:11).

One day this drama will come to a conclusion. "For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the Lord. Therefore encourage one another with these words." (1 Thessalonians 4:16-18)

What a day that will be! As excited as the Jewish people were anticipating the coming of the Messiah the first time, we Christians should be even more excited as we wait for his return. That is why reminders of the return of Jesus are peppered throughout the New Testament. From the picture that Jesus paints of the wedding party watching for the bridegroom to the end of Revelation where we see the triumphant Jesus riding in on a white horse, the early church was taught to anticipate the return of Jesus with excitement!

There is even a very short prayer that Christians would utter when thinking about it: Maranatha! It is originally an Aramaic word, so it likely goes back to the earliest church. It means "O Lord, Come!" Come because we need you! Come because we can't wait to meet you face to face! Come because we love you!

I would like to see us incorporating this sense of joyful anticipation into our prayers. The Second Advent is coming, perhaps sooner than we think. Let us pray that Jesus comes soon!
