Acclimation or Transformation?

This past week I was checking on some thermostats here at the church building, making sure they were set right for the winter months. Most thermostats have a setting or a program for Cooling and a setting or program for Heating. In our house we usually set our thermostat at around 75 in the summer to keep our house cool and then we switch over in the winter to (depending on whether it is my wife or I), 65 or 69, to keep us warm.

Does that strike you as odd? The last time I checked, 75 degrees was warmer than 69 degrees. Yet in the summer my 75-degree house feels cool, and in the winter my 69-degree house feels warm. What happened? Is the warmer temperature suddenly cooler than the cooler temperature?

The answer is to this dilemma is that we experience a process called "acclimation" the process or result of becoming accustomed to a new climate or to new conditions. In the winter months we become accustomed to it being cold outside so when we enter a 69-degree house it feels warm. The same thing happens in the summer time, when surrounded by a climate of 98 degrees, setting our AC at 75 degrees feels pretty good.

It is a natural occurrence that we become acclimated to the climates or conditions we surround ourselves with. In Romans 12 we are challenged to watch out for the dangers of becoming acclimated to the culture we are surrounded by that rejects God. Romans 12:2 - Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing, and perfect will.

We are challenged not to become like the lost culture around us, but to stay connected to God's plan for our lives. I want to encourage you to pursue three different disciplines to help in the continual process of keeping our minds renewed in our pursuit to follow God's will:

- 1. Spend time daily in the Bible. The Scriptures reveal to us what God's good will is for our lives.
- 2. Spend time daily in Prayer. Prayer keeps us connected to our lifegiving God.
- 3. Spend time daily cultivating Relationships that help to strengthen your faith walk.

Romans 12:1 - Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship.
