

What Shall We Say?

Before writing any of my bulletin articles, I am often saying to myself "What shall I write about?". This week as I asked myself that over and over, it reminded me of these words in the Bible "What shall we say?" so I looked up the quote and was surprised to find that it is used nine times in the New Testament and seven of them are in Romans.

The verse that came to mind originally was Romans 6:1 "**What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase?**" This made me reflect on my life and how we often act like we don't sin when we come together on Sundays for worship service. The truth is that we all sin and need God's forgiveness and saving grace! Help us to encourage one another to live better each day according to God's instructions.

Mark 4:30 is another passage that came up in my search. "Again he said, **"What shall we say the kingdom of God is like, or what parable shall we use to describe it?"** This is the introduction to the parable of the mustard seed in which the kingdom of God is compared to the mustard seed which is the smallest seed but grows to be one of the largest bushes. We can take comfort in knowing how big God's kingdom has grown and we pray that it continues to grow.

The other scriptures that came up in my search are listed for your review and study.

Romans 3:5 *But if our unrighteousness brings out God's righteousness more clearly, **what shall we say?** That God is unjust in bringing his wrath on us? (I am using a human argument.)*

Romans 4:1 ***What then shall we say that Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh, discovered in this matter?***

Romans 7:7 ***What shall we say, then? Is the law sinful? Certainly not! Nevertheless, I would not have known what sin was had it not been for the law. For I would not have known what coveting really was if the law had not said, "You shall not covet."***

Romans 8:31 ***What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?***

Romans 9:14 ***What then shall we say? Is God unjust? Not at all!***

Romans 9:30 ***What then shall we say? That the Gentiles, who did not pursue righteousness, have obtained it, a righteousness that is by faith;***

I Corinthians 14:26 ***What then shall we say, brothers and sisters? When you come together, each of you has a hymn, or a word of instruction, a revelation, a tongue or an interpretation. Everything must be done so that the church may be built up.***

As we worship today, let us remember that we are here to focus on God but also to encourage one another in all that we say and do.

Pat Jackel had cataract surgery Thursday. Please keep her recovery in your prayers.

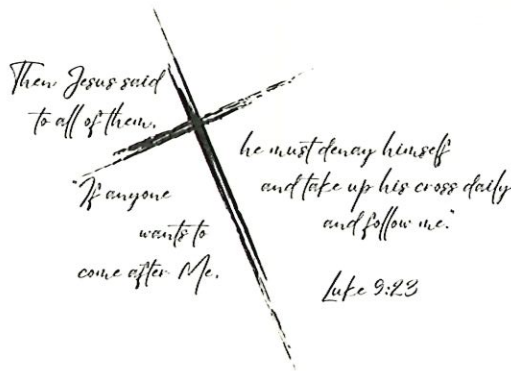
