

Opportunities to Serve

Matthew 25: 34-36

"³⁴Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world.'³⁵For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in,³⁶I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me."

We have the opportunity to do all these things in York, Nebraska. In fact, there are so many things that are happening, that there might need to be part two of this article. Here are just a few.

Twice a year, there is a clothing giveaway for the people of York. This isn't just a two day per year event or even just the week before to set up the give away. It is an event that takes place year round. Every week there are people from East Hill that pick up clothing and sort it in preparation for the giveaway days. There are people throughout the year that donate so there is enough to give away. In doing so, we are clothing people in need. If you want to serve in this way, check with Michele Briggs to find out how to get started.

There are several East Hill members that are part of a teaching ministry at the women's prison in York. They go there on a regular basis and teach. But it's more than that, they build relationships with the women there. They make connections and tell them about Jesus. This past week, Erin DeHart posted about finding more books for

her students. She posted a link on social media to offer the chance for people to donate a book. If you want to serve in this way, check with Erin, and you can buy a book for one of the students.

Each month, the Food Bank of Lincoln comes to York. Volunteers from East Hill and York University come together to distribute food. Hours before the food distribution begins, cars line up on Florida Avenue for blocks and blocks. Once the distribution begins cars continuously come through the line for about an hour, open their trunks, and volunteers load the food for the families. Each month, about 250 families pick up food that is loaded by our members. If you want to serve in this way, check with Tonya Carr. She needs about 10-15 volunteers each month. This month's distribution is this Tuesday. If you can commit, let her know and she will count on you.

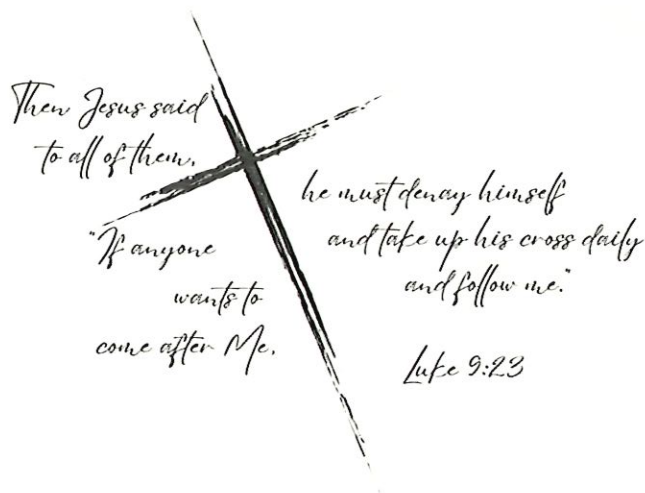
